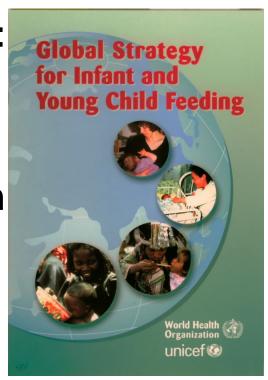

1. Aim of WHO/UNICEF Global strategy for Infant and Young Child Feeding

Global Strategy For Infant and Young Child Feeding

- 5500 children die everyday due to poor infant feeding practices
- Many suffer long term effect of:
 - –Impaired development
 - -Malnutrition
 - Increased infection and chron illness
 - Rising rates of obesity



AIM OF GLOBAL STRATEGY

- To improve through optimal feeding:
 - -The nutrition status
 - Growth and development
 - –Health and
 - The survival of infants and young children

AIM OF GLOBAL STRATEGY

It supports exclusive breastfeeding for 6
months, with timely, adequate, safe and
appropriate complementary feeding, while
continuing breastfeeding for two years
and beyond

 It also supports maternal nutrition, and social and community support.

2. Aim of Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI)

Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI)

- BFHI is a global initiative of WHO and UNICEF.
- To give every baby the best start in life.
- Launched in 1991,
 - end of 2004 more than 19,000 health facilities worldwide Baby-friendly.
- Malaysia, the BFHI started in 1992,
 - almost all government hospitals have been designated Baby-friendly.

The Aim of the Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative:

- 1. To implement the **Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding**, and
- 2. To end the distribution of free and lowcost supplies of breast milk substitutes to health facilities.

Step 1: Have a written policy that is routinely communicated to all health care staff

A policy helps to:

- Ensure consistent, effective care for mothers and babies,
- Provide a standard of practice that can be measured,
- Support actions.

Step 2: Train all health care staff in skills necessary to implement the policy

- The policy should support:
 - all of the Ten Steps
 - training assists to implement these Steps.

Course Aims

The aim of this course is that every staff member will confidently support mothers with early and exclusive breastfeeding, and that this facility moves towards achieving Baby-friendly designation.

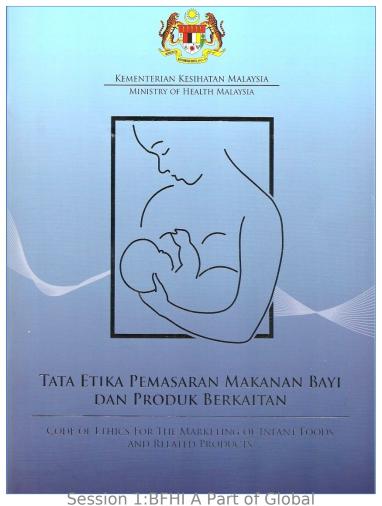
